asking Loy questions and it becomes more conversational. Beginning at 22:30, Loy is mostly off mic and the quality isn't as good, though it's mostly still audible. The conversation at this point also becomes a little more informal.

At 40:00, in the final minutes of the recording, Loy tells a dramatic story about an accident involving his dad who was the engineer on a stopped freight train which was hit from behind by the Southern Pacific's Imperial passenger train.
